Resistance fighters in the underground press on the online platform Resistance in Belgium!



On 21 October 2024, CegeSoma/State Archives launched **Resistance in Belgium**, the national database on the Resistance in Belgium. This new tool now allows everyone to consult online data on the thousands of people involved in Resistance activities during World War II, in Belgium and, sometimes, in neighboring countries such as France.

What's new?

Thanks to the sustained efforts of an ever-growing team of volunteers and CegeSoma staff members, the Resistance in Belgium platform has just reached a new milestone. Already containing more than 42,000 biographical files on resistance fighters linked to the Belgian intelligence and action services, it has been expanded with nearly **23,000 new biographical files on people who applied for the status of resistance fighter in the underground press**. This means that nearly 65,000 biographical files on resistance fighters are now available on the online platform!

Ultimately, the database should contain information on more than 200,000 people, from more than 350,000

individual files.

What does "resistance in the underground press" mean?

Starting in the summer of 1940, men and women began producing and distributing periodicals that escaped censorship. There were about 675 of these publications, only about 20 of which were still in circulation at the end of the occupation. This underground press, which represented a variety of political tendencies, was one of the first forms of resistance against the occupiers in Belgium. Some of these publications were very sporadic and had a limited circulation, while others had a wide reach, especially in French-speaking Belgium. The underground press had many objectives: to boost the morale of the population, to counterbalance German propaganda, to encourage active resistance, etc. Of the tens of thousands of people who participated in this movement, at least 1,650 died as a result of Nazi repression.

What 's on the new files of resistance fighters in the underground press?

Along with a detailed ID card for each person, there are the names of the movements and/or networks they belonged to, the national recognition status they applied for and maybe got, and if they faced repression, info about it.

The files on those who obtained the status of resistance fighter in the underground press (more than 12,000 cases) also contain information on the underground newspapers in which they participated as distributors, editors, directors, and/or printers. A link to the presentation of these newspapers, to their digitized content (<https://warpress.cegesoma.be/en>), and to the files from which the files originate completes the information.

Want to explore the platform?

It couldn't be easier: just go to <https://resistanceinbelgium.be>. You can perform a simple search by name or place of residence, or a more complex search using SPARQL queries, which allow you to cross-reference hundreds of thousands of pieces of information according to various criteria.

For example, the online platform allows you to determine that 83.3% of people who applied for recognition through the underground press were men and 16.7% were women. Just under half of them were granted this status. As a result of their resistance activities, 23% of women and 30% of men were sentenced to prison.

The platform is very well documented and includes a Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ) section, which guides users step by step through their research and answers questions about the nature of the files and data available.

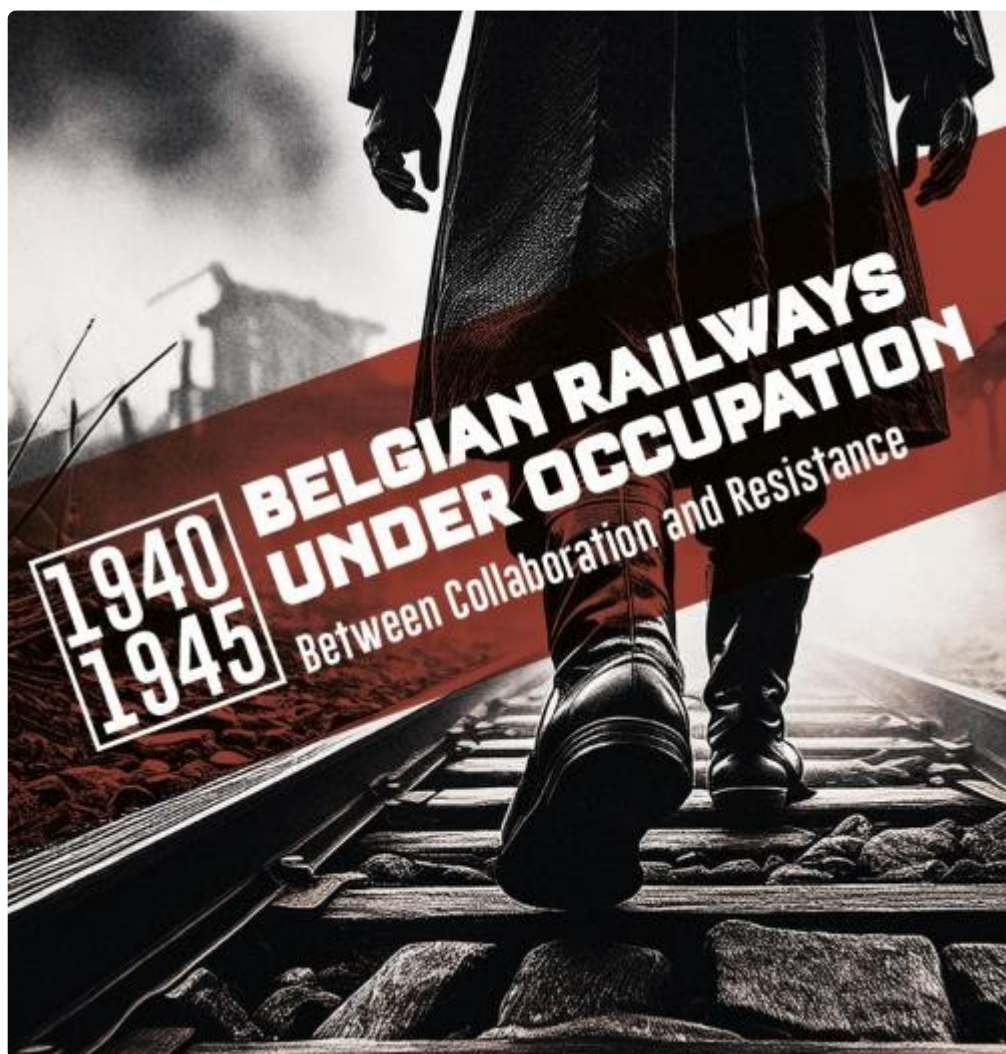

On 25 September, the temporary exhibition '**Belgian Railways under Occupation: between Collaboration and Resistance**' has open at Train World in Schaerbeek.

This exhibition is part of the NMBS/SNCB's remembrance activities and is based on research carried out by CegeSoma at the request of the Belgian government on the role of the Belgian railways during World War II. Nico Wouters, curator of the exhibition, published a book (in Dutch and French) on the subject in 2024 : '[Belgian railways under occupation. The SNCB confronts its wartime past: between collaboration and resistance](#)'. In it, he analyzes the Belgian railway company's policy of cooperation, without shying away from any thorny issues. The history of the NMBS/SNCB during this complex period is full of contradictions, between collaboration and resistance. This dilemma remains relevant today. How far can we go in making compromises with a dictatorship in order to serve the public interest? When and how is it better to resist?

Workshop Report: “The Korean War and Belgium”

CegeSoma, 19 September 2025



On 19 September 2025, CegeSoma organized a workshop entitled “*The Korean War and Belgium*”, marking the 75th anniversary of the outbreak of the Korean War. Although often referred to as a “forgotten war”, the conflict had lasting implications for Cold War geopolitics—and for Belgium, which contributed troops and diplomatic efforts during the hostilities. The workshop focused on exploring archival sources and recent historiographical approaches to the Belgian dimensions of the Korean War.

Held at CegeSoma’s conference room, the event brought together historians and researchers from several Belgian academic institutions, including the Royal Military Academy (KMS), the State Archives (*Rijksarchief/Archives de l’État*), *KU Leuven*, the *Vrije Universiteit Brussel (VUB)*, and the War Heritage Institute (WHI).

Participants, among whom one Belgian veteran of the Korean War, were welcomed to the conference room for an afternoon of in-depth historical presentations and discussions. The opening presentation provided a historiographical overview of how the Korean War has been studied within Belgian academia. **Michael Auwers** highlighted the limited but growing interest in this topic, focusing on key works that have shaped the field and exploring avenues for further research. **Widukind De Ridder** revisited the pivotal summer of 1950, when Belgium decided to participate in the Korean conflict. He examined the social-economic and political outlook of Belgian society in the years before the war, and elaborated on Belgian communist and anticommunist reactions during that Summer.

The next presentation took the audience from Belgium to East Asia, as **Jan Van der Fraenen** offered a detailed account of the Belgian(-Luxembourg) battalion's activities in Korea, discussing military operations, troop morale, and the symbolic importance of Belgian involvement. The final presentation before the coffee break explored the largely unknown episode of Belgian Carmelite nuns abducted during the war. **Adrien Carbonnet** shed light on the Belgian diplomatic response and the role of Belgian envoys in Tokyo.

The second half of the workshop took off with a presentation by **Jan Naert**, who introduced key archival sources that support a social historical approach to Belgian involvement in Korea. He focused on military justice archives and personnel records, underlining their potential for future research. The first results of this research were presented by **Nina Nijs**, who discussed criminal offenses committed by Belgian soldiers and their impact on the local Korean population. Her analysis provided an innovative and nuanced look at military discipline and intercultural interactions during the war.

Johan Massart then examined how Belgian newspapers reported on soldiers killed in Korea, raising questions about national memory and the media's role in shaping public perception. The final presentation, by **Kevin Gony** and **Ben Schraeverus**, reflected on how the Korean War has been – and will be – represented and at the Royal Army Museum, drawing attention to curatorial choices and the evolution of public history displays. The day concluded with a well-earned reception, allowing participants to exchange ideas and discuss future research collaborations.

The workshop offered a rich and multifaceted exploration of Belgium's role in the Korean War, with a strong emphasis on archival research and underexplored narratives. Presentations addressed both military and civilian perspectives, including the media, diplomacy, religious figures, and the local Korean population. CegeSoma's initiative contributes to reviving scholarly and public interest in a conflict that remains overshadowed in Belgian collective memory.

German propaganda services in Belgium and occupied northern France (1940-1944)

In May 1940, the German army invaded Western Europe and placed these territories under strict control. To support this military occupation, the *Wehrmacht* created propaganda services with the specific task of addressing the occupied populations. It was in this context that the *Propaganda-Abteilung Belgien* (PAB) was created in Brussels. Its purpose was to reach out to Belgians and northern French people in order to maintain order and exploit the territory economically, while spreading National Socialist ideology. Until now, no overview of the *Propaganda-Abteilung Belgien* was available. This gap has now been filled thanks to Louis Fortemps' doctoral thesis.

He analyses in depth this German propaganda service responsible for overseeing the various types of media and cultural circles in occupied Belgium and northern France. The *Propaganda-Abteilung* controlled the press, radio,

and cinema, as well as theater, literature, music, and the visual arts. It also set up branches in the major cities of Belgium and northern France. But its mission remained difficult. It had to address the Flemish, French-speaking Belgians, and French people of Nord-Pas-de-Calais. Studying the *Propaganda-Abteilung* also means examining the influence of Propaganda Minister Joseph Goebbels.

To study this organization, the author drew on the *PAB* archives rediscovered during his research, documents from Berlin institutions, and Belgian and French post-war judicial archives.

How did the *Propaganda-Abteilung* function in practice? What were its prerogatives? How much influence did it have on the media and culture in occupied Belgium and northern France? What were the profiles of the propagandists? What was their relationship to National Socialism?

Louis Fortemps will answer these questions, which are the result of years of research carried out as part of his doctoral thesis, on Wednesday, 15 October. The debate will be moderated by Chantal Kesteloot. This event will take place in the CegeSoma conference room as part of the Public History Meetings, in partnership with the non-profit organisation 'Friends of CegeSoma'.



Louis Fortemps is a doctoral student in History and Communication at the University of *Lille* and *KU Leuven*. His dissertation focuses on German propaganda services in occupied Belgium and northern France (1940-1944). He is more generally interested in the question of the German occupation and has published a book '*La police secrète de la Wehrmacht en Belgique (1940-1944)*' with Vincent Gabriel. At the same time, he is also conducting a research project on the correspondence of German soldiers.



Chantal Kesteloot is in charge of public history at CegeSoma/State Archives. She is especially interested in the phenomenon of commemorations, the place of the past in public space, and the role of images. She coordinates the Belgium WWII website.

CegeSoma, the non-profit organization Helden van het Verzet, and the VUB chair Sporen van het Verzet invite you to participate in a study day on 28 November 2025 at the VUB Campus in Etterbeek (Promotiezaal D.201). The (re)discovery of German payments to people convicted in the context of the repression of collaboration in Belgium led the Belgian Parliament in 2019 to pass a resolution calling for an end to this practice and for the establishment of a commission of historians to study its origins and mechanisms. Although the resolution had no impact, the scientific questions remain relevant. They refer to a lesser known aspect of Belgian-German relations after the Second World War and raise the question of a striking imbalance between German financial compensation for collaborators and that for victims of Nazism. The study day aims to review the current state of the issue and formulate new avenues of research.
